



I have stated supports in my NDIS Plan what does this mean?

Stated supports

Any services listed in your NDIS Plan as 'stated supports' are not flexible. This means funding has been allocated for a specific support or service, and you can't use this funding for something else. You cannot swap 'stated supports' for any other supports in your plan. 'Stated Supports' must be purchased as they are outlined in the plan and some will require a quote.

What are some common Stated Support examples?

- Preparation and delivery of meals
- Support Coordination
- Plan Management
- Residential aged care

What are In-Kind Supports - Pre-Paid

If there are supports in your plan that are listed as 'in-kind', it means the service has already been paid for by your state, territory, or the Australian government.

Quote required

Supports which are listed as quote required in your plan, means extra information such as a quote or specialist assessment/report must be completed and sent to the NDIA for review. If the quote is approved, additional funding will be made available in your plan
